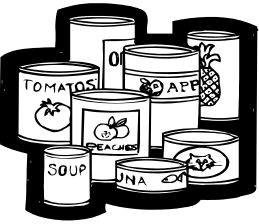


URGENT!! support needed for one of the schools in Kibera, Nairobi, Kenya.

Leaflets are available in church ; cheques & donations should be made payable to Kanzi Kibera Friends Ltd and Helen will bank them. **THANK YOU.**



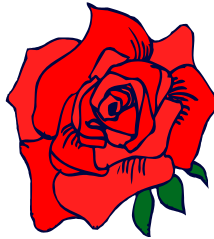
FOODBANK With the church now open **please support the Foodbank by leaving items in the basket in the porch.**
